### ABOUT THE SCRIPT

Thank you for your interest in Raven-Winged Hours. You keep our company alive and inspire us to continue adapting classic works for the modern audience. We are The Archive Theater Company, and as you might have guessed, this is an original adaptation, as many of our works are. Raven-Winged Hours was originally the idea of Jennifer Rose Davis, our fearless leader. She is the lead adapter for most of our scripts, and we would not exist without her passion for literature. When Adriana Fontánez heard the first draft at a play reading, she felt compelled to join the project. Adriana is an enthusiast for Poe's work, perhaps even a monomaniac. After countless hours, revisions, and head-butting collaboration, a beautiful adaptation was born. This work is special to us, and we needed just the right director. Chris Fontanes blew us away with his creativity, and agreed to do the project on one condition—that he got to add his favorite story to the script. We were so grateful for his input, and his vision brought our adaptation to the next level.

Jennifer wanted to structure this show in such a way that the audience could have a refresher of Poe works that they were likely familiar with before introducing them to new content. For this reason, we open with *The Raven* and *The Tell-Tale Heart*. Jennifer knew from the beginning that she also wanted *The Cask of Amontillado, Berenice,* and *Dream Within a Dream*. Adriana was a little obsessed with weaving together works with similar themes, so be on the lookout for some out-of-context quotes from different works, or direct references that blend the worlds of Poe's stories. Chris chose to include *Mask of the Red Death,* which was highly appropriate for our post-pandemic world and introduced some stylistic variety with the inclusion of a narrator.

Our love of Poe runs deep, and we want our audiences to leave with the same love of the macabre that brought us together. We took the opportunity to introduce Austin to some underrated Poe content, and we hope you feel inspired to read more of his works that you're less familiar with. There's a little bit of Poe in all of us, and we hope Raven-Winged Hours highlights the gruesome creator that you are.






























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
